## Create a Family Disaster Plan

A family disaster plan can help keep your family safe during hurricane season. First, know if you live in an evacuation area. Next, know your home's vulnerability to **storm surge**, **flooding** and **wind**.

Your plan is based on this knowledge. The following options will help guide your decision to stay at home or evacuate. If you live in a mobile home or on a boat, you must always evacuate.

**Option A:** **Stay at home.** If your home can withstand the expected winds, and you are away from the coast and not in a flood prone area, consider staying home.

**Option B:** **Stay with a relative, friend, or hotel outside the evacuation area.** If you plan to do this, make arrangements in advance. Consider where you will go if the friend or relative is not home.

**Option C:** **Relocate out of the area.** Local officials will tell you which evacuation routes to use. Plan your route ahead of time, also plan alternate routes. Include maps and directions in your hurricane kit. Leave early to avoid high wind and flooding.

**Option D:** **Go to a public shelter** if you have no safe place to go. Local media will announce which shelters are open. Do not wait until the last minute to learn the route to the shelter.

## IMPORTANT

- **Evacuate if ordered.**
- **Move quickly but without panic.**
- **Execute your family plan.**

If your surge zone is a 3 or higher and your garage door and windows are protected and you answered NO to most of these questions, you can consider sheltering in place for up to a category 3 storm.

- Have at least a 2 week supply of medications on hand during hurricane season. If your medication requires refrigeration:

- Medical support equipment (wheelchairs, dressings, feeding equipment, etc.)
- Purchase extra batteries for your electric wheelchair, hearing aid, etc. What will happen if they aren't working?

## Plan for Boats:

Do not weather the storm in your boat, RV, or mobile home. Develop a detailed plan to secure your vessel in the marina well before hurricane season. If permitted move your boat from the threatened area, or take your boat to a previously identified hurricane refuge. Practice your plan to see if it works.

- Consolidate all records including a recent photo, registration, insurance policies, equipment inventory, marina or storage agreement, and telephone numbers such as harbor master, Coast Guard, insurance agent, National Weather Service, etc.
- Check your lease or storage rental agreement. Know your responsibilities and liabilities as well as those of the marina
- Take action early. The storm's fringe activity will make preparations more difficult.
- Never leave boats on davits or on a hydro lift.
- Move small boats to safe shelter.
- If your boat remains in berth, check strength of primary cleats, winches, and chocks. They should have substantial back plates and adequate stainless steel bolts.
- Double all lines with rig crossing spring lines fore and aft. Attach lines high on piling to allow for tidal fall and rise of surge. Protect lines from chafing by covering rub spots with leather or old garden hose.
- Charge batteries for automatic bilge pumps.
- Seal all opening with duct tape to make boat as water tight as possible.
- Reduce dock or piling crash damage by securing old tires along the sides of the boat.
- Remove loose gear from the deck. Store it securely inside or at home.
- For a boat stored on a trailer, lash the boat and trailer down in a protected area. Let the air out of the tires before tying the trailer down. Place blocks between the frame and axle, inside each wheel. Secure with heavy lines to fixed objects in all 4 directions. Or, you may remove the boat from the trailer and lash down each separately.
- Remove the outboard motor, battery, electronics, and store them.
- Small boats can be filled with water for added weight after lashing down.
- Put your boat in the garage, if you have room.

- Do not weather the storm in your mobile home, travel trailer or recreational vehicle.
- Check tie downs.
- Put up storm shutters.
- Secure all loose articles in yards and around the trailer.
- Leave early when evacuating with your travel trailer or RV.
